Your child's report will still show their progress across all subject areas.

Teacher comments will appear in English, mathematics and the general comment section, in line with department policy*.

The general comment for Kindergarten also covers all other key learning areas including, creative arts, HSIE, PDHPE, and science and technology.

A new achievement scale and descriptions are included to provide a clearer picture of your child's progress.

Parent-teacher interviews remain an important way to discuss your child's progress and achievement in more detail.

Parent/Carer Role Supporting Student Attendance

When your child attends school every day, learning becomes easier and your child will build and maintain friendships with other children. Parents and carers can help foster positive attendance habits by:

- reducing disruption to learning where possible, by planning any necessary appointments outside of school time

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Science with Mrs Schenk Term 2

This term students in year 1 and 2 will learn about the external features of a variety of living things, identify and group plants and animals using their external features, identify that living things live in different places that suit their needs and record the changes in growth of a common plant or animal, using uniform informal units and appropriate technologies.

Year 5 will learn to describe the structural and/or behavioural features of some native Australian animals and plants and why they are considered to be adaptations, plan and conduct a fair test to show the conditions needed for a particular plant or animal to grow and survive in its environment and describe how changing physical conditions in the environment affect the growth and survival of living things.



Drama Term 2

Year 1 and 2 students will learn to:

Understand the difference between a role and a character

Identify how characters differ depending on their traits and backstory

identify and express emotions using facial

expressions and body movement

Communicate with verbal and non-verbal communication.

Year 5 will learn to:

Understand stereotypes and archetypes in the context of characters

Identify the characteristics and features

associated with each genre

Identify and create dramatic tension and relief









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Veg-tastic lunchboxes

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines* (2019).

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- · formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information.
